# The Common Cup

At our PCC meeting this week, it was agreed that we would reintroduce the Common Cup at Mass on Sundays. A number of churches locally, including the Cathedral, have reintroduced the chalice and we feel now is the time to give you the option. As we do currently, the congregation will come forward to receive the bread from the priest. There will be either one or two chalice assistants at his side which you may go to receive the wine, or you may just return to your seat down either of the side aisles as you do now. Nobody should feel obliged to drink from the cup if they feel uncomfortable with it. Communion in one kind is just as valid as receiving both the bread and the wine. *Fr Neil*

# Our beautiful building

The PCC has approved the following with reference to application for necessary Faculties in respect to our beautiful church. The rationale for these changes is two-fold: first, to ensure that by making the space flexible we can use the building to attract income by hiring out the church for concerts etc; secondly, to enhance the worship of the community in making the altar closer to the people and ensuring the choir and servers can move more easily around the chancel.

- Replacing the chairs with lighter, stackable chairs shared at PCC, colour to be confirmed
- Mounting a piece of welcome artwork produced by the school above the double doors into church from the narthex
- Removing the stone altar and altar rails, replacing the flooring in the chancel and relocating the nave bookstands to the chancel as choir stalls.

# The Piano and Organ

The organ is in need of constant upkeep and is in a sorry state at present. I am working with Rick to see how best to maintain worship without having to spend vast sums of money on the current instrument. I am clear that there is **no moral case for spending in excess of £150,000** to restore the current instrument. What we are looking into is concert grade improvements (re-tuning and repairing the mechanical section of the Great in particular) as well as in the longer-term, investing in an electronic portable manual organ which was so well received and loved at the cathedral during their building work. Again, there will be more to report in due course.

Of immediate concern is our piano which is now at the point of putting off choirs and groups from using the church for rehearsals and performance space, thus now costing us rental. Our proposal is to look for 'loans' from you, the congregation rather than dipping into our trusts. Mindful that we run at an annual deficit of over  $\pounds$ 50,000, we need to invest wisely to attract income at the same time as raising money from our own pockets. The piano is an obvious opportunity to look at raising funds from within the living community including 'loans' which are paid back following concerts in which the piano is showcased, for example. We can also look to our own congregation for gifts in this respect. If you are interested in making such an offer, please do speak with our Treasurer, Patrick. We are looking to spend in the region of  $\pounds 15-17,000$  for a good pre-owned Steinway (or similar) and so a series of 'loan offers' from you, the congregation, will enable us to secure the purchase soonest.
