Reader: Caroline Coleman Reading: Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the LORD came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then he said to him, 'I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and

a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.'

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved.

Vocation, Ministry and Service

Last Sunday we launched phase 2 of our Stewardship Campaign. Through Lent in our worship and Lent groups we are exploring Vocation, Ministry and what it means to be disciples. There is also something active and reflective for each of us to do through Lent – that is to look at our own ministries – what we bring and contribute to being the church in this place and in the world beyond.

In the Narthex/porch there is a new display which explains this more – please take time in the coming weeks to pause and look at it. Beside it there are many leaflets on a stand, which explain a very wide range of individual ministries – what each involves, what is needed to fulfil them, and who to talk with to find out more. Some require a big time commitment, but many require very little time. Some (headed blue) apply specifically to Sunday worship ministries. Please help yourself to as many of the ministry leaflets which interest you and ponder on the skills and experiences which you bring to this place, and the time you have to give. You may want to let go of some of the things you currently do – or explore new ministries – or simply carry on with what you currently give.

When you are ready, fill in the back page of one of them, tear it off and put it in the box. Please fill one in, even if you are carrying on as before. After Easter the right person will contact you to explore with you how to take forward your offers of service. At our Pentecost worship, all of our ministries will be celebrated and blessed.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting

Our annual meeting will be held after Mass on 6th April. Please see the board at the back of church for details of elections that will be taking place at that meeting. All those on the Electoral Roll will be emailed a copy of the Annual Report and Accounts a week before the meeting, so a very good reason to make sure you have your name on the **Electoral Roll by the deadline** of 21st March.

We all have to reapply to join the Electoral Roll – have you done your application yet?

It's an important way of confirming your commitment to St Nicolas' community and to the vision of the church. It means you can vote on church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) and stand for election to the PCC or Deanery Synod.

This year the Electoral Roll has to be completely renewed – **no names are carried over** from the old Roll and everyone must make a new application to be included.

To join the Electoral Roll you must be aged 16 or over (or due to turn 16 this year), you must be baptised and a member of the Church of England and EITHER living in the parish OR have attended St Nicolas' regularly for at least 6 months.
