Bring forth the people who are blind, yet have eyes, who are deaf, yet have ears! Let all the nations gather together, and let the peoples assemble. Who among them declared this, and foretold to us the former things? Let them bring their witnesses to justify them, and let them hear and say, 'It is true.' You are my witnesses, says the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me. Cath says: Visiting the Church of St Bartholomew the Great near Smithfield Market in London this week, I was struck by this Damien Hirst statue they have of their patron. Entitled *Exquisite Pain* it uses the traditional imagery of the saint holding his skin over his arm, clutching the knife that tortured him, but Hirst gave it a twist special to St Bartholomew's Church and Hospital: the body is based on an anatomical model and the knife is a scalpel. "I like the confusion you get between science and religion ... that's where belief lies and art as well." *Damien Hirst*
